2015 Patuxent River Conference "Next Steps"

The 2015 Patuxent River Conference was held June 18–19, 2015 at the Jefferson Patterson Park and Museum located on the Patuxent River. Eighty participants from thirty-six organizations came together to learn and share about research, monitoring, restoration, and management occurring within the Patuxent River watershed. Facilitated discussions enabled participants to brainstorm and prioritize gaps and questions of concern about the future of the Patuxent River.
